Your cooperative is dedicated to helping the people in our service area, not just by keeping the lights on, but by making a positive impact on the quality of life. The People Fund is proud of the positive impact it has had in increasing security, safety and health-awareness within communities. The organization has also helped to prepare and educate our community's growing children by funding several local educational programs for students from elementary to college.

The People Fund, funded by Operation RoundUp®, has proven to be a successful program providing financial assistance to non-profit agencies and community activities in our area, we can share a simple and rewarding way for Consolidated Electric members to contribute in our communities.

If you participate, your monthly Consolidated Electric bill is automatically "rounded up" to the nearest dollar. For example, if your bill is \$62.71, you'll pay \$63.00, with 29 cents going directly into a special fund administered by the Consolidated Electric Foundation's Board of Trustees. Members who participate will contribute about \$6 each year—a small amount to help worthy causes in our community. The program gives members a simple way to contribute to charitable purposes. Consolidated Electric, as a corporation, may also contribute funds to worthy causes. Operation RoundUp® is a way for members and Consolidated Electric to combine their efforts to do even more for our communities.

The People Fund has awarded more than \$621,428 to neighbors, agencies and groups in need since it was established in 2002. Because of the generous support from members of Consolidated Electric, Consolidated Gas and Bright Energy more than \$92,000 was awarded to recipients in 2010. Many of the recipients were awarded through our program because alternate funding was simply not available.

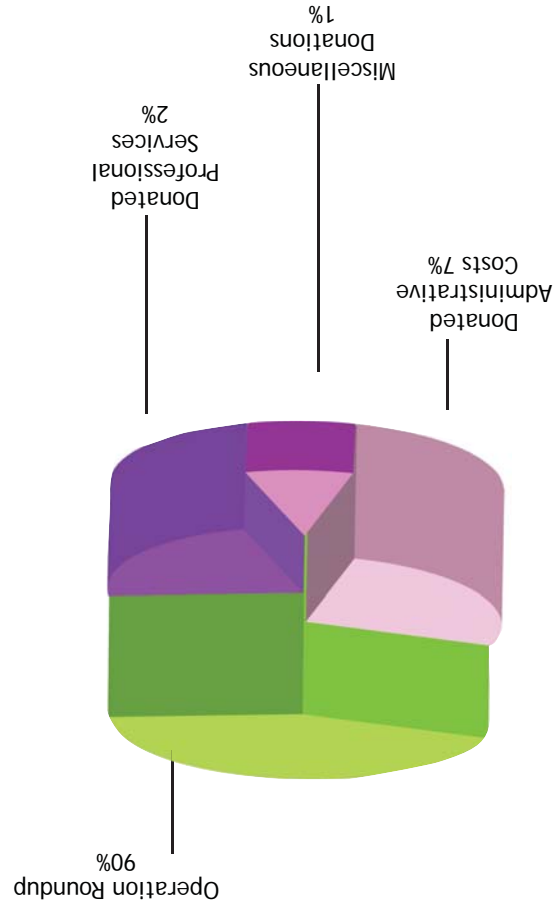

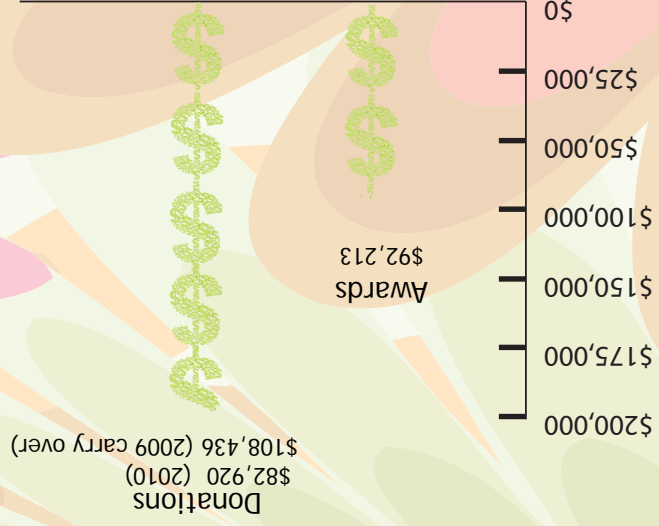
The People Fund is a charitable program that provides funding for individuals and groups in need of assistance.
